Paloma Plan:

CADILLAC OR EDSEL?

Werner Scharf applied for a permit to change the zoning on Paloma Ave. so that he could build forty units of low-moderate income housing for senior citizens and 80 parking spaces for the community. Yes THAT Werner Scharf.

I suppose I should say thank you. That would be the gracious thing to do. I should feel grateful. Optimistic. I don't. I feel tired. I seem to be asking the perrenial virgin's question, "Is that all there is?"

I've lived in Venice for twenty years. For at least fifteen of those 20 years my life has been contolled by the whims of THAT MAN, or people like him, or people who think they are like him. For over 20 years THAT MAN has had power over hundreds of people. He has had the power of regulating their lives, and sometimes their incomes.

"Are you going to struggle against the Scharf building?", someone asked me. "I don't think so, it's forty units for senior citizens"....

"But that's because he wants the Cadillac apartments turned into a bed and breakfast Inn. And he's trying to evict all the old people from that place."

"Yeah, well but he says that this place is going to be for low to moderate income seniors..."

"That's what he says, but he could wriggle out of it. And you can't discount the fact that some of that parking is going for some of Scharf's businesses."

Neighborhood meetings were held. The moving spirit of the meetings seemed to be distrust of Scharf. And who could blame them? For years he had done with his property anything he wanted to.

Then it seemed after years of anonymity, Scharf made his power known again. Buying, selling, buying the Cadillac Hotel owned by Ben Gross who kept the rents low for his tenants, a large portion of which were senior citizens. After buying the Cadillac, Scharf tried to evict the tenants.


So the residents of Paloma Ave, Sunset Ave, Dudley Ave speculated on what this speculator would do next. Forty people in a fortyfive foot high building on the walk streets. Quite an impact.

Some people met with the buolder Mr. Haskins. "Mr. Scharf will do anything you want-less stories, different arrangements anything. Of course the less stories, the less senior citizens."

People were told that the project would be entirely subsidized by Werner Scharf, and that he would agree to a contract that would bind him to his promise to house seniors.

A group of people eho were involved with the Venice Coastal Committee came up with plans. Other people circulated a petition against the change in zoning.

I'd heard all the arguements before. I'd heard them when affluent families protested against low-moderate family housing on the Redwood tract in Venice, I'd heard the arguements agianst low-moderate housing on #one Venice Boulevard for senior citizens, and I'd heard the light and air arguement on the aborted Safran project on Navy and Ocean Front Walk. Oh Godness!!! Light 'n' air! Light'n'air lightnair it'll cut off my lightnair I moved here and I didn't think any thing would be done with that vacant lot across from me. Of course, when I built my 2 story single family house with my 2 garage spaces on the vacant lot I bought and then shared the place with 3 other adults who also had cars,



But it was a surprise to hear some of possibilities of housing the elderly poor because it would further complicate the parking and cut off their lightnair -- All of these people live within two short blocks of the Pacific Ocean.

When I first moved into my present home, the first thing out of my landlord's mouth was, "There is no parking, and I mean no parking at all."

Now that beautiful vacant lot that used to hold all those cars of the homes and apartment buildings that were not built for 2 or more car families was to be used for a building. Replacement parking would be supplied -- but in the meantime dust, workmen would disrupt the area. People seemed

disinclined to put up with temporary disruption to house the elderly poor. Surprise, hell. I felt as if I were kicked in the stomach. Again.

A public hearing was to take place Monday Jan 23 in West L.A. before a zoning commissioner.

Despite the fact that the zoning my neighbors remain intransigent about the change was a Q zone--that means Qualified and to be used for a building only for the purpose of low-moderate income elderly, some of the people still didn't like it. Light'n'air quality of life ambience traffic flow. One man, who I shall call Mr. Capet, suggested that Werner Scharf create an endowment fund to move the Senior Citizens somewhere else. He was killing me softly with his figures. A woman who lived in the Ellison Apartments, a 60 unit building 45 feet high said yes, her lightnair would be cut off, but she c nidered that a decent trade off if the elderly poor were to be housed.

It was argued that 4 condos on that lot containing 2 or 3 children would create more intensive use of the property, more cars, more noise, more music, more dogs than forty single seniors, most of whom would be to poor to own let alone maintain a car.

And there was Mr. Brown quoting the North Beach Specific Plan where it stated that height bonuses would be given for



Interestingly enough, long time residents seemed more in favor of a senior citizens housing development even though they had apprehensions about how to effect a longterm legally binding contract to keep Mr. Scharf to his promises. The newer residents seemed more concerned with lightnair and ambience and less willing to negotiate a compromise that would preserve both the human feeling of the walk streets and the needs of the elderly poor. This definition of the quality of life seemed to encompass prettiness, "quaint" surroundings and the ability to brunch at one of the trendy restaurants on the Ocean Front Walk that encroach on the public walkways and who have no parking.

It's obscene to me that one man has the power to disrupt the lives of hundreds of people and to change a community to suit him.

The fact that this man wants to give back a few of the low income units that he has taken away does not make me grateful. Maybe, maybe all that yelling and screaming did some good and got through to Mr. Scharf.






We'll Take Manhattan

The Wetlands

At its January hearing in L.A. the California Coastal Commission voted 9-3 to approve massive development of the Ballona Wetlands. The Land Use Plan(LUP) for the Summa Corp's 1,000 acres south of the marina channel, combined with new development in Marina del Rey envisions 20,000+ more people in this area. This new city will generate 100's of thousands of new car trips every day on already existing roads, including Lincoln Blvd. which is currently taxed almost to its limits.

The 2 main traffic "improvements" in the LUP are the Marina Bypass and the Falmouth "cut-through". The former will connect the Marina Freeway and Lincoln Bl with Washington Bl -- supposedly to cut down on traffic problems on Lincoln, especially at its intersection with Washington. There appears to be little rational thought behind this road which could easily become the first leg of a road, along the railroad right-of-way, thru Venice. The Falmouth Ave extension is even more egregious. It extends Falmouth Ave in Playa del Rey to Culver Blvd and was originally sipposed to go right thru the wetlands, a route which the staff of the commission recommended against. The commission, turning a deaf ear to its staff and the public, approved the road to be built on pilings above the wetland! Certainly the people and animals using the wetlands won't notice that.



Finally, the commission may have tolled the death knell for the wetlands, the last such in all of L.A. county. The LUP sets aside 175 of the wetlands for "preservation" despite much testimony indicating the inviability of such a small area. Summa, which purchased the entire wetland for what it will charge for one condominium, just couldn't see its way clear to protect this valuable resource. Our thanks to commission chair Mel Nutter, and commissioners Callahan & Hisserich for voting for the wetlands.

Come soon and come often and support your community!



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
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


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
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DOT'S ALL, **FOLKS**

The dot in the middle square represents all the firepower expended during World War II -3 million tons of explosives. The other dots represent the firepower of the world's present nuclear weaponry, 6,000 World War II's or 18,000 megatons, split about evenly between the US and the USSR. Two squares (300 megatons) represents enough firepower to destroy all the large and medium sized cities in the world.

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Code of the 40th President

On October 31, 1983 500 internationally respected climatologists, physicists, politicians, & journalists assembled in Washington, D.C. to hear a two-day report on "The Long Term sorldwide Biological Consequences of Muclear Kar," The following excerpts were taken from The anvironmental Catastrophe of Nuclear war by Jim Hardy & Mike Shuman in the December 1983 issue of Not Man Apart, the news journal of Friends of the Earth (FOE).

"Along with 100 of their biological & physical science colleagues, (Paul) Ehrlich & Carl Sagan assembled the world's most sophisticated climatological models to calculate the effects

of a series of muclear scenarios.

"In the scientists' base scenario one-third of U.S. & Soviet arsenals are detonated, about 5.000 megatons. (one megaton represents the explosive power of a million tons of T.N.T.) According to new World Health Organization estimates more than 1 billion people would be killed instantly & a second billion would almost certainly die shortly thereafter. The Sagan-Erlich study addressed the next phase.

"The intense heat generated by the blasts would set off tremendous firestorms, igniting everything in their path, producing massive quantities of PCB, dioxin, vinyl shloride, cyanides, carbon monoxide, & furans that would fall to earth in deadly rains. The blasts would also convert much of the nitrogen in the atmosphere to an oxide form that would combine with & destroy portions of the earth's ozone barrier, exposing survivors to high levels of ultraviolet radiation.

"The ground-level nuclear blants would lift phenomenal quantities of soil & soot into the atmosphere -- more than 100,000 tons of very fine dust per megaton of blast -- in a cloud so thick ... only 5 percent of the sun's normal light would reach the earth's surface. Because the particles would be so much finer than those released in volcanic explosions, they would not fall out quickly Land temperatures in the northern hemisphere would plunge to -13 degrees F. & stuy below freezing for months, except for narrow coastline strips, according to Carl Sagan, 'Virtually all crops & land animals, at least in the northern hemisphere, would be destroyed, as would most verieties of uncultivated or undomesticated food supplies. Plest human survivors would starve.'

"Biologist Paul Ehrlich's group's findings corresponded to Carl Sagan's, adding that '... the damaged ozone layer above would allow penetration of high levels of ultraviolet radiation, which is particularly dangerous to phytoplankton.' And that ' ... radioactive fallout from such a war would also be far greater than prior estimates, in part because new "low-yield" MI RV'd weapons produce more fission debris at a lower altitude than older gargantuan warbeads...

"Sagan & Ehrlich & their colleagues estimated that 30 percent of the northern wid latitude land area would receive doses higher than 250 rads (the LD-50, or dose level expected to kill half the population exposed to it) from fallout, ingestion, & inhalation, not counting any blast exposure. With targeting of reactors & reprocessing plants, exposures would be significantly higher

"The southern hemisphere would not be spared. The enormous heat of the explosions & subsequent overnight plunge into 'nuclear winter' would create enormous temperature differences between north & south, forcing global mixing of soot, earth, chemicals, & radiation.

"... The most shocking finding of the entire study was that 'an epoch of cold & dark almost as severe as in the 5,000 megaton case' could be triggered by a war involving 100 megatons of explosive power, one percent of superpower areenels & a fifthieth the size of the base case. No prior analysis had ever presumed the possibility of such serious damage from so small a nuclear exchange.

"The two reports -- one of biological effects & the other on global climatic effects together with all the technical documentation are slated to be published in Science magazine under the authorship of 50 distinguished scientists from the U.S., Europe, & the Soviet Union."

Under the topic "New Data, New Models, New

Results," the report continues:

"How could these effects have been underestimated by so many for so long? 'In technical studies of the consequences of nuclear weapons explosions, ' reported Sagan, 'there has been a dangerous tendency to underestimate the results. This is partly due to a tradition of conservation which generally works well in science, but which is of more dubious applicability when the lives of billions of people are at stake

"... Only two reports of any stature or competence throughout the 1970's weighed the longterm effects of nuclear wer: a 1975 study by a National Academy of Sciences (NAS) committee which examined the 'Long Term Worldwide Effects of Multiple Nuclear Wespons Detorations; & in 1979, the Congressional Office of Technology Assessment's report on 'The Effects of Nuclear war. . . .

... When asked if there was any significance to the timing of the conference on October 31, the 31st anniversary of the first hydrogen bomb explosion, Sagan only noted that the day was Halloween, which was originally a Celtic holiday that marked the beginning of winter."

Under the topic "Doom & Gloom", Donald Kennedy, President of Stanford & a noted biologist, in a keynote speech said: "... A major muclear exchange will have, among its plausible effects, the greatest biological & physical disruptions of this planet in the last 65 million years No longer is it acceptable to think of muclear war in terms of mimutes, days, or even months. What we have learned from the biologists & atmospheric phycicists is that the proper time scale is years The risk estimates on which our strategists have been working & citing to citizens are grossly optimistic."

"In a teleconference with the Soviet Union which lasted an hour, Drs. Ehrlic & Sagan discussed the findings of their scientific group, via satellite, with a panel of top Soviet scientists & 100 of their associates seated in a Moscow television station. With giant screens in front of the Washington Sheraton's auditorium, the American audience watched the Soviets, who, in turn, watched the Americans.

"While the Soviet scientists' findings were generally in agreement with their U.S. counterparts, some U.S.S.R. experts offered areas of new concern....Kyrill Kondratyev, a member of the Soviet Academy of Sciences, showed that hitrogen oxides from nuclear blasts, besides depleting stratospheric ozone, might weaken the penetration of solar radiation to a level 10 degrees Celsius lower than that caused by dust & soot. Nikolay Bochkov, another Academy of Sciences member, expressed particular concern about long term genetic damage to all forms of life. And Alexander Bayeev, a biologist, worried about unknown synergisms of all these effects.

MA tense momant occurred when Carl Sagan asked whether Soviet scientists would be willing to let American scientists examine measurements of the Soviet above-ground nuclear tests that preceded the 1963 Limited Test Ben Treaty. At first, the Soviets, well aware of diplomatic discomfort over breaking national secrecy rules, evaded the question. But when Sagan pushed for an answer, Roald Sagdeyev, Director of the Soviet Institute for Cosmic Research, promised to pursue a release provided Sagan pushed for simultaneous release of U.S. aboveground nuclear test date,

"Evgeny Velikhov, vice-president of the Soviet Academy of Sciences, offered perhaps the most moving words of the broadcast & the conference. Perhaps these findings, he hoped, would give superpower leaders a new impulse to disarm. He warned that the results demonstrated that a limited muclear war was impossitle & nuclear superiority a dangerous illusion. 'Muclear weapons,' Velikhov commented. 'can no longer be tools of war or politics; they are only instruments of suicide. Nuclear weapons are a cancerous growth that threaten humanity Mither we will destroy the cancer or it will destroy us."

In 1937, during his strictly acting days, our president starred in two files: Secret Service of the Air & Code of the Secret Service. in both he plays the role of Brass Bancroft, a man who gives up his steady job as a commercial airlines pilot to join the Socret Service. In the first acenario he amashes a smuggling ring that is bringing aliens into this country; in the second, he uncovers the operations of American counterfeiters in Mexico.

After the 2nd scenario, Code of the Secret Service, was finished, our president felt the film was so bad, he appealed to the studio not to release it. warners compressed & released it everywhere except the L.A. area. thereby enabling the actor to escape embarrassment among his friends. Later, while visiting a distant city, our president was standing outside a theater, looking at the posters of the stills, when he was recognized by the ticket taker who said: "You should be ashamed."

Now, 46 years later, our president is starring in a new scenerio, Code of the 40th President. In it he plays the role of Ronald Reagan, a man who gives up a stoady job of acting to become this nation's 40" president, a president with lots of backbone, who smannes communists & their dupes everywhere with the help of God

a lots of conventional a muclear weapons. So Far, most of those who are seeing it are giving it terrible revues. m

what will?



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

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
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
